- 7.03 Computer/Electronics New computer purchased and in place. Total \$700.88 (under budget!) Plan to take older hard drives for possible refurbishment
- 7.04 Summer Student Positions/Grant the library does not qualify for 100% coverage of the student wages, and this year they decided to enforce that rule. If we get the grant it will be for 50% of the student wages, 8 weeks, 30 hours/week \$15/hour 4% TTL \$3888 grant would cover 1/2.

This would put us approximately \$981 over salary budget. I am confident with myself and other staff working less hours, especially over the summer this amount would be covered. MOTIONED by Vi Preston-Enns, SEConded by Doreen Pym that we proceed with hiring two students and make up the difference in wages.

7.05 Little Library – PCH – set up library rack on March 6<sup>th</sup>. Stocked with books from donations and from weeding (24). Left bookmarks and suggestion/request box. Waiting to hear from MB Housing with regards to setting up similar in Bonny Vista.

- 8.01 Building Mtc seeking quotes from local contractors for metal siding for building. Stucco is falling off in places and it was hard to patch. Plan to apply to Ice Fishing Derby for grant (90%). Jenn to come back to the board with a run down on costs/budget.
- 8.02 Library Courtyard would like to develop this idea, present to Town council, and apply for Coop Community Spaces 2024 and/or LdB Foundation. Jenn to come back to the Board with a run down on costs/budget.
